

Paola Parravicini was born in Milan, where she completed her studies and currently lives. After obtaining her diploma at G. Berchet grammar/high school in Milan, she graduated in Law at the Milan State University in December 1989, with an Economics thesis on the efficient use of inputs in the public health sector of Lombardy. After graduation she obtained two grants from Fondazione Costantino Bresciani Turrone, which allowed her to continue her studies in economics and statistics both in Italy and abroad. In particular, in 1992 she was Associate Student at the post-graduate courses on Economics at the Queen Mary and Westfield College in London, and in 1993 she was Visiting Student at the London School of Economics, where she attended courses on Monetary Economics and Banking with prof. Charles Goodhart.

She was researcher in Economics at the Milan State University.

She taught Economics and Economic Policy at Istituto Universitario di Lingue Moderne (I.U.L.M.) in Milan, Economic Policy at the Insubria University in Como, and Media Economy at the Master in Law and Communication at the Milan State University. Here she also taught Statistics and Advanced Economics. Since 2005 she has been associate professor of Economics at the Faculty of Law of the Milan State University, where she teaches Economics and Industrial Economy and Policy.

She carried out research on the efficiency of the health sector, on the economic impact of usury and money laundering offences and, particularly, on economies of scale and scope in the banking sector.
